Synthia L. Hardy (Writer/Billie Holiday) is an Award-winning actress, singer, dancer who has appeared in film, on T.V., commercials (radio and T.V.) and on stages nationally and internationally. She was recently featured in the film, Sylvie's Love. She won the 2011 NAACP Theatre Award for Billie! Backstage With Lady Day for Best One Person Show. She also won two Artistic Director Achievement

Awards (A.D.A.) for the same show (Billie!...) for Best Actress in a Musical or Comedy and Best One Person Show. Synthia won an Emmy Award for the documentary, Precious Memories: A Stroll Down 47th Street and has received other awards and nominations for her work, including another NAACP Theatre Award, Dramalogue Critics Award (twice), LA Weekly Award (just to name a few). Some of Synthia's work includes: *Home*; *Merry* Wives of Windsor; Flyin' West; Rap Master Ronnie; The Little Dreamer: A Night in the Life of Bessie Smith and A Corner of Gold. She has written and starred in her own cabaret show, Dinner Musicale with Synthia & Friends. Synthia has toured with various singing groups doing tributes to Oldies and Doo Wop girl groups. Synthia has sang backup for Della Reese in a gospel choir and other shows, Bruce Willis' blues Band and others. She has toured extensively in and out of the United States singing tributes to Motown, the Oldies and various girls' groups. Synthia is originally from the Windy City, Chicago. Bryan Rasmussen (Director), the recipient of the 2016 Valley Theatre Award for Artistic Director Achievement, is now in his 18th year as Producing Artistic Director of the Whitefire Theatre celebrating its 40th anniversary season. Bryan is one of the most prolific theatre producers in Los Angeles. He has produced over 1000 solo shows and hundreds of regular plays including numerous world premieres. Directing credits include the 35th anniversary production of Sam Shepard's Buried Child, Billie! Backstage with Lady Day, Firehouse, The Bellflower Sessions, and Stella's Last JDate as well as The Tavern at the Durango Melodrama in Colorado. He is currently developing theatre projects with Academy Award winner Bobby Moresco as well as launching multiple world premieres. He also produces the largest solo theatre festival on the West Coast called *Solofest* where over 80 shows premiere in 90 days which is in its 12th year. He also founded the famous Itchey Foot Cabaret in downtown LA in the 1980s as well as having been a member of the famed South Coast Repertory playing Young Scrooge for 9 years and when they won the Tony for Best Regional theatre in 1985. Numerous film and TV credits as an actor include 24, Sons of Anarchy, The Mentalist, and American Horror Story opposite Jessica Lange. He trained at the American Conservatory Theater in San Francisco after receiving his BA in Theatre from Cal State Long Beach. Bryan is a proud member of the Actors Gym.

Lanny Hartley (Piano Man/Musical Director) is a jazz pianist, conductor and composer who began his career as the pianist for his church in Burlington, New Jersey. With a solid gospel music background, he went on to study Music Education at Indiana University. Jazz piano became his love and he performed with great jazz artists such as Wes Alexandra, Ernie

Andes, Jon Hendricks, Lou Rawls, Linda Hopkins, and Ernestine Anderson. Lanny has also played for pop artists such as Thelma Houston, The Fifth Dimension, Joe Tex, Syreeta Wright, Al Wilson, and David Clayton Thomas. He has been the Musical Conductor/Director for such shows as *Ain't Misbehavin': Tracks* (Yolanda King); *The Late Great Ladies of Blues and Jazz* (Sandra Reeves): *The Della Reese Musical Tour*; and *Dinah Was* (New York, Los Angeles, and Williamstown). Hartley's screen credits include the television movie *Sinatra* as a blind piano player, the motion picture *Harlem Nights* as a piano player, and as the church organist in the ABC television series *Soul Man*, starring Dan Ackroyd.

Woody Woods (Piano Man) was born and raised in the inner city of Los Angeles. Woods is an author, a self-taught composer, conductor, lyricist, and pianist. Blessed with the opportunity to conduct Parade of the Chariots, from the movie Ben Hur, during his final year in Junior High School, Woods became hooked on directing bands, choirs and orchestras. He also had one of his original arrangements performed by the school Jazz Band that year. Thus, the fire was lit, and there was no putting it out. Woods was originally a woodwind player specializing in tenor sax, flute and clarinet. He began to take the piano seriously when the pianist in his high school Jazz ensemble (The Jazz Executives) joined another band. Since the band could not play without a pianist, Woods starting playing the piano and never did get back to any of his woodwinds. Today, Woods has turned his time and talent toward sharing his thoughts and feelings with the world in the form of prose & poetry. In addition, he is directing and producing several video projects that feature his music and poetry. He now resides in Las Vegas and performs around the world.

Bobby Wilkerson (Drums/Papa Joe Jones) is an industry drummer for the groups Troop, LTD, Slave, Mark Wood of Lakeside and producer for Fox Sports and countless up-and-coming indie artists. He played on *Tribute to Motown* and *Oldies But Goodies* tours and various and special events. Bobby also teaches at organizations that help kids learn about music.

David "D Wake" Wakefield (Saxophone/Lester Young/"Prez") began playing sax in his 7th grade band class. Realizing his "gift" over the next few years, Darryl worked his way up to the class of musicians performing regularly at local favorite night spots such as the Famous "Baker's Keyboard Lounge" in Detroit and the now gone popular "Alexander's" and "Murdocks." Darryl has recorded on projects with many Ensembles including the Band "Orange Lake Drive" with David ("D LEE") Lee and the band "The Edge" Bassist Al Turner, and also Drumm, the launching pad that catapulted Darryl into the ranks of the "Aer Ron Otis helped create list" Artists/Sidemen. The last 19 years, Darryl has been Touring with UNIVERSAL / MOTOWN Recording artist "KEM." Keep watching! As Darryl prepares to record his debut CD, he will provide updates to his page continuing to let you know what's next for this smooth sax man.

Mark Allen Felton (Saxophone/Lester Young/"Prez") honed his musical skills playing in clubs in the Los Angeles area while appearing in videos by Ed OG & the Bulldogs and Tony! Toni! Toné! Felton produced his first solo CD *On The Prowl* in 1994 and went on to share the stage with many artists including Al Jarreau, Oleta Adams, Patti Labelle, Chaka Khan, Kenny G., Kirk Whalum, Dave Koz, Billy Preston, Marcus Miller, Lalah Hathaway, Jeffrey Osbourne, and many others, and has also toured with Ray Parker Jr.



PLAYRIGHT'S NOTE

"Like so many, I have long been fascinated with Elizabeth Taylor, a pop culture icon who continues to captivate more than a decade after her death. In her youth, Taylor epitomized movie stardom, later becoming associated with her fabulous jewels, her popular perfumes and her activism in the fight against HIV/AIDS. But what is the story behind the image? How does a star develop into a legend, and how does that legacy sustain itself? With *Call Me Elizabeth*, I hope to pay tribute to the life of this extraordinary woman by exploring how the strength of her character enabled her to break barriers with unshakable bravery and with signature style. I thank Gary and the Board of Directors for the opportunity to share this piece with the audiences of Sierra Madre."

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

When Kayla first sent me *Call Me Elizabeth*, I'd been staying-at-home for almost two months. I was still shocked by my broken routines and freshly afraid of dying young. I thought Kayla's play was eerily aligned with this strange and scary time we're all enduring.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

We meet Elizabeth Taylor in the summer of 1961, basking in the glow of her recent Oscar win and recovering from a case of pneumonia that nearly killed her. Production for *Cleopatra* has shut down due to her hospitalization, and for the first time in her adult life, Elizabeth is compelled to take an extended break from her normally frenetic schedule. She's had a lot of time to think. And she's getting ready to take back control of her life and her story.

Elizabeth grew up as a child star on the movie lots of MGM. Like Judy Garland before her, and countless others in her wake, she learned a painful truth: When you are young and famous, there is no such thing as control. Especially for young women.

Neither the media nor the public have changed their appetites much in the past 60 years. We still build women up so that we can destroy them. I'd never given Elizabeth Taylor much thought before I started research for this play. But her story has struck a deep chord in me and challenged me to examine the ways I still unthinkingly participate in the misogyny of our tabloid culture.

Today, I've been staying-at-home for a year. After my first read of the play, in those dark days of Spring 2020, I told Kayla, "Oh my god. You wrote a play about DEATH." We've lost so much life over the past 12 months. As we inch closer to that light at the end of the tunnel, I'm reminded that the other side of death is REBIRTH. And I wonder, after our long year away from each other, who will we decide to become next?


